CALIFORNIA DELTA FISHING

SEPTEMBER THROUGH JANUARY: Striped bass, huge sturgeon, salmon and catfish are your best bets, with some largemouth bass showing in early fall.

FEBRUARY THROUGH JUNE: Striped bass, largemouth bass and catfish.

JULY THROUGH AUGUST: Catfish, crappie, bluegill and shad, with some largemouth bass in deep water.

THINGS TO DO THE CALIFORNIA DELTA

THE WATERWAY

The California Delta is a fabulous network of rivers, tributaries and channels that creates over 1,000 miles of navigable waterways. The three major rivers feeding the Delta are the San Joaquin, Sacramento and Mokelumne.

INTERESTING SIGHTS AND SIDE TRIPS

The infinite variety of the area must be experienced to be appreciated, from tree-lined banks festooned with wild berry vines, to sandy beaches, to isolated jungle-like isles. There are drawbridges that open to allow boats - even houseboats - to pass through, and you can share the waters with ocean-going vessels, sailboats, a paddle boat or two, and an old Chinese junk. The historic towns of Walnut Grove and Locke are waiting to be explored. Locke was built and inhabited by the Chinese immigrants who built the levees that protect the Delta farmlands. Numerous waterfront resorts and restaurants are scattered along the banks.

Sacramento's Old Towne and Stockton's Waterfront are two nearby attractions for visitors to the Delta. Old Towne is made up of several blocks of shops and restaurants that have been authentically renovated to create a turn-of-the-century environment. Although somewhat similar, the theme of The Waterfront is nautical rather than old western, and the ambiance of its many small shops and restaurants pleasingly reflects this nautical theme.

OTHER SPORTS

Golfers will enjoy the new 18-hole championship public golf course and driving range, "The Reserve at Spanos Park", located a short 2 miles from the marina.

NEARBY TOWNS

Stockton is the closest city to Paradise Point Marina, located just five miles south on Interstate 5. Shopping centers, grocery stores, lodging, and medical facilities are located in Stockton.

DIRECTIONS TO PARADISE POINT MARINA

From Southern California:

1. Take I-5 North thru Stockton.
2. Exit at 8 Mile Road and turn left.
3. Go approximately three miles to Rio Blanco Road and turn left. This will lead straight to the Marina.

From the Bay Area:

1. Take 580 to I-5 North thru Stockton.
2. Exit at 8 Mile Road and turn left.
3. Go approximately three miles to Rio Blanco Road and turn left. This will lead straight to the Marina.

From Northern California, Oregon & Washington:

1. Take I-5 South thru Sacramento.
2. Exit at 8 Mile Road and turn right.
3. Go approximately three miles to Rio Blanco Road and turn left. This will lead straight to the Marina.
